Royalty and the Jews

The Jewish community in the United Kingdom has always taken Rabbi Chanina's dictum to pray for the welfare of the ruling powers (Ethics of the Fathers 3:2) very seriously. Siddurim (daily prayer books) and Machzorim (festival prayer books) published in England have printed the prayer for the salvation of the Monarch from at least the time of King George III who reigned from 1760 to 1820. Of particular interest are two items produced during the ten month reign of Edward VIII who abdicated to marry Wallis Simpson. Jewish items relating to him are extremely scarce. Items are listed in chronological order.

It is interesting to note how the Anglo-Jewish practice of giving honour to the Royal family in the synagogue spread to Palestine during the Mandate years. The text of the poster is in Hebrew. It measures approx. 18.5 inches across by just over 12 inches in height. £425

This collection of items reflects scholarly interest in the history of the synagogue, the development of liturgy, rabbinical personalities and the contemporary, evolving role of the synagogue in the life of a community. Items are in alphabetical order.

This greatly angered the Jewish community and Rabbi Hirschel preached numerous sermons in the Great Synagogue warning parents not to send their children to such schools. This warning was read out in the Great Synagogue and on the following Sabbath at the New, Hambro and Western Synagogues. Bevis Marks refused to accept it. Hirschel's opposition to the missionary schools provided a boost to the Jews' Free School which was founded in 1817. **£525**

Federation of Synagogues: Special Collection (Items 416 - 454)

The Federation of Synagogues was established in 1887 at the instigation of Samuel Montague (later Lord Swaythling). Concerned that the formality and august cathedral like edifices of the United Synagogue were alien to the recently arrived immigrants from Eastern Europe, he organised the small Chevrahs and Shtibels into a Federation to support each other. It started with a group of 16 minor congregations which grew to 51 by 1912.

This unusual collection of primary material provides an interesting snapshot of an immigrant community in London in the 1920s and 1930s. For example, the language of synagogue documents reveal how immigrants adapt to changing social realities. At Grove Street Great Synagogue, the 1923 AGM and financial report was all in Yiddish. By 1939, half was in Yiddish, and by 1948 it was mostly in English. In 2003, Grove Street synagogue, and most of the others in this list, no longer exist. Financial statements, fundraising activities and membership cards are part of this wide-ranging collection that would make an important addition to a library or museum collection. **£3,850**

573. **SAMARITAN INSCRIPTION FROM SECHEM, SAMARIA. (see illustration on back inside cover) 1779**

This rare four-line inscription in paleo-Hebrew (with an addition carved in Arabic, in relief) is on a well preserved marble slab. The text is written in Hebrew, using Samaritan characters and is from a synagogue in Nablus (the ancient Shechem). Currently, the Samaritan community has approx. 650 members, living in Holon and Mt Gerizim in Israel.

Line 4, Part 1: 'Amen',

Line 4, Part 2: 'This blessed house was built in Jumada I 1193', This is in Arabic and corresponds to the 18th May - 16th June 1779. This date was probably added later because although Samaritans have used Arabic since the 10th century, they used Samaritan only for formal inscriptions.

Provenance: The printed description, read by the former owner, Dr. Alfred Cooper Fryer, to the Clifton Antiquarian Club on 27th November 1895, (Vol iii. pp. 149-150), states '... The stone was sold by the officers of the Samaritan Church to the Chief Rabbi of the Dutch Jews, and ... eventually ... my father (the late Alfred Fryer of Wilmslow) ... purchased it in the East in ... 1870, and had it sent to England'. Dr. Fryer was elected F.S.A. in 1901.

When his son donated this stone to the Bristol Baptist College, he said "it would appear that, at a much later date, the unoccupied portions of the stone were utilised for another inscription in Arabic. This might refer to extensive repairs, or a rebuilding of the synagogue, or to some other building in the town. It is no uncommon thing to find the Arab conquerors carving their inscriptions on ancient tablets."

M. Baillet lists all the known 137 surviving inscriptions in his important article, 'Samaritains' in 'Supplément au Dictionnaire de la Bible', ed. Jacques Briend et al., Vol. XI, 1990. (pp. 860-874). The inscription in this catalogue is not mentioned in his article and is new to the world of modern scholarship.

- 575. Torah Scroll.** circa 1920 from North Africa, written on goatskin. The rollers are not original and the size of the scroll is 45cm. It is not currently Kosher and does need some repair before it could be used as a Sefer Torah. **£4,000**
- 576. Bayswater Synagogue. Silver 3 branched Shabbat Candelabra.** Inscribed ‘London 1890, Bayswater Synagogue’ on the base. The Candelabra is from Vienna and dates from 1880. It is approx. 20 inches high and spans 16 inches. It has the blessing for the Sabbath candles in relief along the base. It also has Hermann Adler’s name engraved in Hebrew between the words Bayswater Synagogue which is in English. Hermann Adler was the Rabbi there for 27 years. Adler, who was one of the most renowned preachers of his day had a very good relationship with the community and he records that he was presented with a cheque for £4,000 (a very substantial amount at that time) and a silver casket. He only left the community in 1891 to take up the mantle of his father as Chief Rabbi who died at the beginning of 1890. An important piece of Anglo Judaica **£6,750**
- 577. Brno Architectural Plans for the Synagogue in Brno Czechoslovakia.** The plans use pen ink and watercolour, and are mounted. They measure 14 inches by 18 inches (including mounts 24.5 x 20 inches) They show the aerial view of the ground floor, the aerial view of the gallery, the front of the building and a side view of the building. The plans are signed. The Synagogue was built in 1855. The architects were Count Johann Julius Romano Von Ringe and Count Schwendernwein Von Lonauberg. **£3,850**
- 578. Kaufmann, Isidor.** Portfolio Isidor Kaufmann with 14 phototypes and two rotogravures. Verlag Manz, Vienna-Leipzig, 1925. With a foreword by Dr Chayes, Chief Rabbi of Vienna, and an introductory text by Hermann Menkes. Several are of Synagogue scenes. See ILLUSTRATION on the front cover. See Isidor Kaufmann by G. Tobias Natter pages 324 – 339 for illustrations and descriptions of all the paintings included. 2 portfolio covers: famous one with the many Stars of David in silver on a blue background is inserted into another portfolio. - 579. New Year Card (Pop up Paper Model of Synagogue)** See front cover. Early 20th Century, printed in Germany. An elaborate and colourful model of a Synagogue during a prayer service with the ark open and Sifre Torah being held by congregants. The card measures 25.5cm x 23cm when closed flat. Says LeShona Tova Tikotayvu – A Happy New Year on the base. Pop up cards with a Jewish theme are uncommon. **ON FRONT COVER £435**
- 580. Tal U’Mata (Dew and Rain).** An Italian 18th Century small plaque approx 14 cm x 10cm. During the winter months the prayer for “Dew and Rain” is added into the daily liturgy. Synagogues usually have plaques or boards which remind the congregants to recite specific prayers at different times throughout the year. It may have been hung on such a board as there is a small hole at the top to hang it up. The plaque is painted and Tal U’mata is painted in the middle. **See picture in the middle of the back cover. £475**
- 581. Adler, Nathan Marcus.** SILK imprint presented “To the Reverend Nathan Marcus Adler, Chief Rabbi of the British Jews, on his first visit to the Maiden Lane Synagogue” London, 1846. Printed on silk, 380 x 255mm., Hebrew and English. Maiden Lane was a breakaway Minyan from the Western Synagogue. The nature of the dispute is not certain but probably stems from a brawl that took place at the Kol Nidrei service which started when the son of Judah Davis was not allowed to sit in the seat his father thought him entitled to. **£725**

- 582. Parochet:** A large fragment of an Antique Eastern European Parochet (cover for the Ark). This antique satin parochet is worn through in places and measures 53 x 100 cm. It contains an embroidered inscription in large raised characters in metal (possibly silver) thread, with three small Stars of David around the text.

- 583. Synagogue poster – rare: a complete halachic work printed as a poster**
Zaler, Isaac be Moshe Menachem, Tikun Yitzchak, Warsaw 1912
This large synagogue wall poster is a compendium of halachic information applicable to reading the Torah on Sabbaths, holidays and weekdays. It includes halachic rulings if a mistake is noticed in the Torah scrolls while reading, errors regarding the calling up of the Cohen and the Levi, and information about the readings for special occasions. There are approbations from Rabbi Meir Yechiel Halstuk of Ostrovtza, a leading Polish Hassidic rabbi, and of two prominent Warsaw rabbis. In his introduction, the author, known for his popular works Yalkut Yitzhak and Minhath Yitzhak, points out that disputes during the Torah reading often arise due to a lack of familiarity with these complex halachic questions. This leads to interruptions to the synagogue services which reflect a lack of respect for the Torah scrolls that remain lying on the reader's desk while a rabbi is consulted. Measuring 80 x 58 cm, the poster has been slightly worn with small holes in places (hardly affecting the text) and is backed by cloth. As far as we can ascertain, there are no other copies available. **£275**
- 584. Agudath Harabonim – Union of Orthodox Rabbis of U.S. and Canada. Broadside. A WARNING AGAINST REFORMS.** Circa early 1950's Single sheet 17 x 11 inch. In English and Yiddish. "The Introduction of certain innovations which violate Jewish law and tradition prompts us to issue this Public Statement concerning Mechitzoth, Microphones and the Gumco-Clamp." **£145**
- 585. NEWSPAPER. Caledonian Mercury. Monday December 26th, 1791.** Broadsheet, 4pp Carries the announcement of the death and brief description of the funeral of Rabbi David Tevelle Schiff the Rabbi of the Great Synagogue Duke's Place. "Sunday died the Rev. D.S. Schiff, high priest of the great synagogue Duke's Place, aged 71. On Tuesday he was interred in the Burying-ground, Whitechapel belonging to that people. A procession was formed of 110 coaches and the rest hackney and private coaches. An immense concourse of people attended this solemnity, which was conducted with much funeral pomp, agreeably to the Mosaic customs". **£250**
- 586. NEWSPAPER. Edinburgh Evening Courier.** October 10th, 1789. 4pp. "His Imperial Majesty has just published an edict permitting the free toleration of the Jewish religion throughout his dominions.... In consequence of this edict two very considerable Synagogues are on the point of being built, one in Prague, the other in Vienna..." **£225**
- 587. NEWSPAPER. Morning Post and Daily Advertiser.** Thursday, December, 13th, 1787. "Since the conversion of Lord George Gordon to Judaism, it is not improbable but his Lordship may be chosen Gatan Torah at the ensuing festival of Duke's Place Synagogue..." **£235**
- 588. Crakow. Great Synagogue Cracow.** Oil on canvas, laid down on board circa 1900, Polish School, signed. Approx 17 x 12 heavy gilt frame 21 x 16 **£2,500**

- 589. Kazmierz.** Watercolour of the Synagogue in Kazmierz, artist unknown but Polish school 1920's. In heavy gilt frame. Size: unframed app. 15cm x 9cm, framed 35.5cm x 32cm. **£525**
