

## Facsimiles of Hebrew and Aramaic Manuscripts and Early Hebrew Printed Books

1. **Babylonian Talmud - Codex Munich 95.** Jerusalem, Kedem, 1970. 3 vols red cloth, folio. This is a facsimile of the only known manuscript of the *whole* of the Babylonian Talmud. It was written in Paris and dates from about 1340 to 1370 according to different scholarly opinions. **£195**
2. **Babylonian Talmud - Codex Florence - Florence National Library II I 7-9. Contains the tractates: Berachot, Bechorot, Temurah, Karetot, Tamid, Me'ilah, Kinin, Baba Kama, Baba Metziah, Baba Batra, Sanhedrin and Shevu'ot.** Jerusalem, Makor, 1972. Leather spine, cloth boards, 3 volumes, facsimile limited edition of 160 copies. The Codex Florence is dated 1177 and is the earliest codex of the Babylonian Talmud. 334 + 312 + 349 pp **£285**
3. **Babylonian Talmud - Codex Hamburg 169 - Tractate Hullin.** Jerusalem, Makor, 1972. An important manuscript of Tractate Hullin, containing numerous textual variants. Of vital interest are the textual notes and variants collected by a late scribe and entered into the margins of the text. These notes are based on manuscripts and traditions otherwise unavailable. A facsimile edition of 160 copies. **£75**
4. **Talmud Yerushalmi – Codex Vatican (Vat Ebr 133).** Jerusalem, Makor, 1970. One of 135 copies with an introduction Hebrew by Professor Shaul Lieberman. **£165**
5. **Midrash – Torath Cohanim (Sifra) Codex Vatican 31 with Seder Eliyahu Rabbah and Zutta.** Jerusalem, Makor, 1972. This is a facsimile of one of the earliest manuscripts of Rabbinic Literature in existence, according to the colophon it was completed in 1073. **Together With (Separate volume) Midrash Leviticus Rabbah and Sifre Numbers and Deuteronomy Codex Vatican 32.** This is an important Midrash manuscript. It has no colophon but palaeographic signs point towards the 10<sup>th</sup> or early 11 century. **£180**
6. **Mishna – Codex Parma "C" Sedarim Nashim Nezikin with the Hebrew version of Maimonides' Commentary.** Jerusalem, Makor, 1971. A limited facsimile edition of 160 copies **£115**
7. **Genizah Fragments of Rabbinic Literature, Mishna, Talmud and Midrash with Palestinian Vocalisation.** Jerusalem, Makor, 1973 number 132 of 390 copies. Edited with introduction & indices by Professor Nehemya Alloni. 219 pp. **£125**
8. **Another imperfect copy 6 pages blank -** **£35**
9. **Mahzor (Festival Prayer Book). Sefardi Mahzor For Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur from the Year 1320. MS. Parma. De Rossi 860** Containing more than one hundred and fifty Piyutim and Ma'arachot by R. Moses Ibn Ezra in Their Original Composition. Introduction by Prof. D.S. Lowinger and J Yahalom. Jerusalem, Makor, 1973. **£245**
10. **Pirkei De Rabbi Eliezer – A Critical Edition Codex C.M. Horowitz.** A complete critical edition of Pirke De Rabbi Eliezer as

- prepared by CM Horowitz but never published. Include textual variants from 15 manuscripts, notes, commentaries and parallels from Rabbinic Literature. An edition of 200 photocopies of the editor's original manuscript, from his personal copy of the Pirke De Rabbi Eliezer. **£85**
11. **Maimonides (Rabbi Moshe Ben Maimon) Mishne Torah Code of Jewish Law. Constantinople 1509.** Jerusalem, Makor, 1972. 4 vols. leather spines with gilt lettering, some minor marking to cloth covered boards. **£265**
  12. **Halachot of Rabbi Yitzhak Alfasi. Ed Constantinople 1509.** Jerusalem, Makor, 1973. Leather spine, bound by hand, no 109 of 290 4 vols. The editio princeps of Rav Alfasi one of the rarest of Hebrew books **£200**
  13. **Sifra or Torat Kohanim According to Codex Assemani LXVI.** Cloth, 460 pp. Facsimile, in Hebrew, with 77 page introduction by Finkelstein in Hebrew. **£75**
  14. **Codex Maimuni: The Illuminated Pages of the Kaufmann Mishneh Torah.** Cloth, folio in dj and slipcase fine. Beautiful facsimile of the illuminated pages from the Kaufmann manuscript of the Maimonides Code of Law. The book has been edited by Dr Alexander Scheiber. **£85**
  15. **Lisbon Bible 1482. Nahar Miskal with the British Library, 1988.** Cloth, intro in English 21 p. by Gabrielle Sed-Rajna and Hebrew 19 pp.. Beautiful facsimile of the illuminated Lisbon bible in the British Library Or. 2626. **£175**
