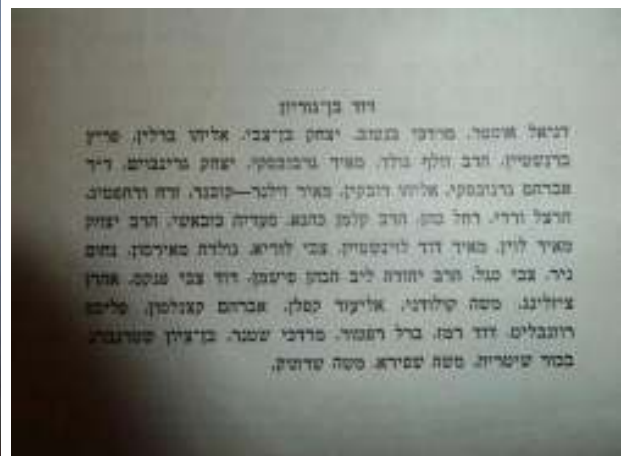

First Printing of the Israeli Declaration of Independence!

1. **Iton Rashmi (Rishmi) Official Gazette Containing the Declaration of Independence for the State of Israel.** First issue of the Official Gazette dated 14 May 1948. Tel Aviv 1948 [12576]

4pp. Text in Hebrew. The first issue of the Iton Rishmi contains the official publication of the Israeli Declaration of Independence as read out by Ben Gurion. 'Decree concerning the Establishment of the State of Israel' - In the Land of Israel the Jewish People have arisen ... (a brief account follows of the events from the First Zionist Congress to date, including the Balfour Declaration) ... Therefore we are gathered together, we, the members of the people's Government, the Leaders of the Hebrew Settlement and the Zionist Movement, on the day that marks the end of the British Mandate over the Land of Israel, and in accordance with the ... decision of the Assembly of the United Nations, we hereby declare the establishment of the Jewish State in the Land of Israel, that is, the STATE of ISRAEL (Medinat Yisrael).' The names of all of the 37 members of the Temporary Government, headed by David Ben-Gurion are listed on page 2. It also contains the annulment of the infamous 1939 White Paper restricting Jewish immigration to Palestine. **£3,750**

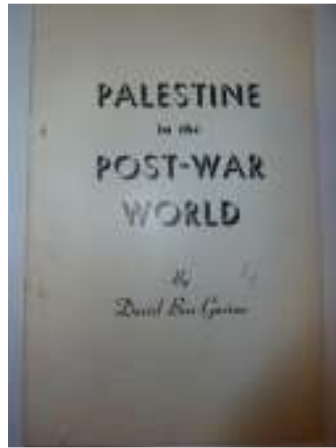
Original wrappers 20cm. . This was the first Passover Haggadah published by the Israeli Defense Forces. "All subsequent Pesach Haggadot published by the army were more elaborate, but since this Haggadah was published right after the 1948 War of Independence, the army used plates of another Haggadah published in the previous year by Lewin-Epstein. Unlike the edition it was copied from, this First IDF edition includes a letter published in the insider front cover to the soldiers from the first Chief Rabbi of the IDF, Shlomo Gorontschik, (Shlomo Goren) who become the Ashkenazi Chief Rabbi of Israel (1973 -1983). He writes in Hebrew 'After 2000 years of physical and spiritual slavery, we have merited to celebrate the festival of freedom.....and Just as we left Egypt and saw miracles, so too we saw in the War of Independence that we waged in our land. Raise high the flag of freedom that you have acquired by your hands in great bravery and self sacrifice as we envision the complete Redemption and celebrate the Festival of Passover ' " See Shalom Freedman - Rabbi Shlomo Goren: Torah Sage and General (page 36) Yudlov 4122 **£375**

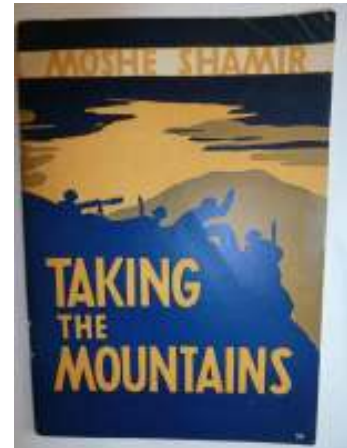

The religious authorities deemed it too close an imitation of the traditional Passover Haggadah and put strong pressure on the publishers to suppress the book. Many copies were destroyed making it a rare and collectable item. Illustrated with photographs throughout. Elegant Hebrew typography. Ornamental frames in colour. Printed in blue green and yellow.

Worldcat lists 5 copies, NLI and 4 in the USA [NYPL, Stanford Hoover, Towson and UCLA Davis] "Reports from American Jewish chaplains, American Jewish soldiers, survivors and members of the American Press persuaded the American Government to investigate the army's treatment of the Jews. As a result, in August 1945, the Office of Advisor on Jewish Affairs was created to keep the Commanding General in the European Theater of Operations (ETO) informed of problems facing Jewish DPs. The office which remained in operation until December 1949, served as an advocate for the needs of the Jewish survivors." From Alex Grobman - Battling for Souls, Page 76 "The founding of the German Federal Republic in May 1949 was the turning point that evoked negotiations concerning the the future of the Jewish community. On September 1, 1949 Harry Greenstein, the adviser on Jewish Affairs in the in the American Zone, called a conference on 'The Future of the Jews in Germany' [Note: the conference was actually on July 31st, Greenstein produced and signed the report on the September 1st - JF] He had two primary objectives: first to bring together the representatives of the Jewish Communities and of the major local and international Jewish organizations in Germany; and second to lay the foundation for coordinating the work of all the interested parties and organizations concerned with the welfare of the Jews in Germany. Greenstein emphasized the need to concentrate on the practical issues rather than on the

complicated ideological or moral questions regarding the future relations between Germans and Jews" From Hagit Lavsky - New Beginnings, p. 212.

This is an important historical document which lists the attendees to the conference and also identifies the individuals that were appointed to the various committees and positions throughout the different zones in Germany. £450

A photographic record of the activities of the Va'ad Hatzala in the period immediately after WWII and the Holocaust. As an American organization with a base in Munich, the Va'ad Hatzala provided for the religious and spiritual needs of the Shearet Hapletah, the survivors. Directed by Rabbi Nathan Baruch, the Va'ad sponsored Yeshivot, schools and synagogues, published religious texts and ran kosher kitchens, distributed Passover products and organized ambulances in the chaos of postwar Europe. This pictorial review provides an extraordinary permanent photographic record of this seminal time and life amongst the DPs in 20th Century Jewish history. £1,500

Although it was written by a Karaite, it became very popular with rabbinic Jews in their fight against missionary activity and arguing against the divinity of Jesus. This is a pocket edition. £350

Rabbi Goren was decisive and never shied away from ruling on difficult and controversial cases. The current book addresses one of the most controversial cases during his career. It concerned the Halachic status of two siblings, Hanoch and Miriam Langer who were facing an issue of mamzerut (bastardy). He cleared them of any hint of mamzerut and allowed them to marry. This case became one of the most controversial halachic disputes in the State of Israel in the 2nd half of the 20th century. 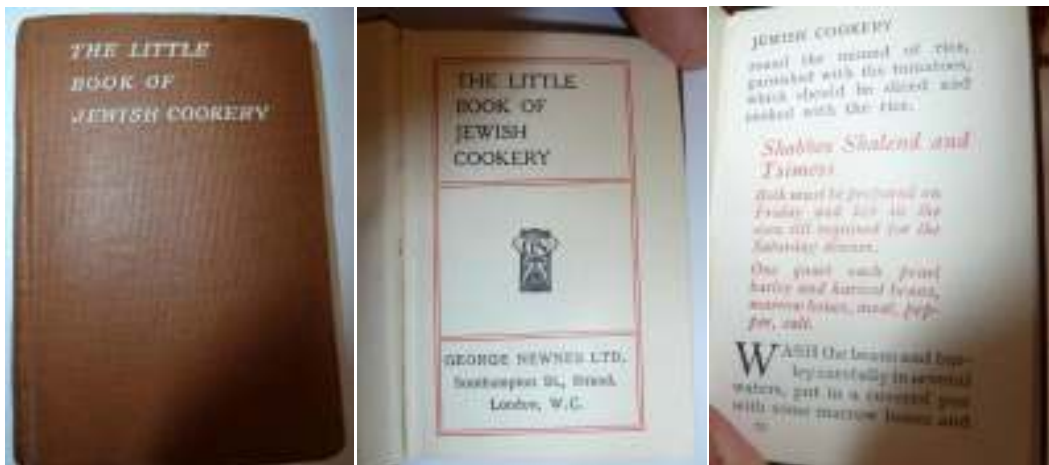

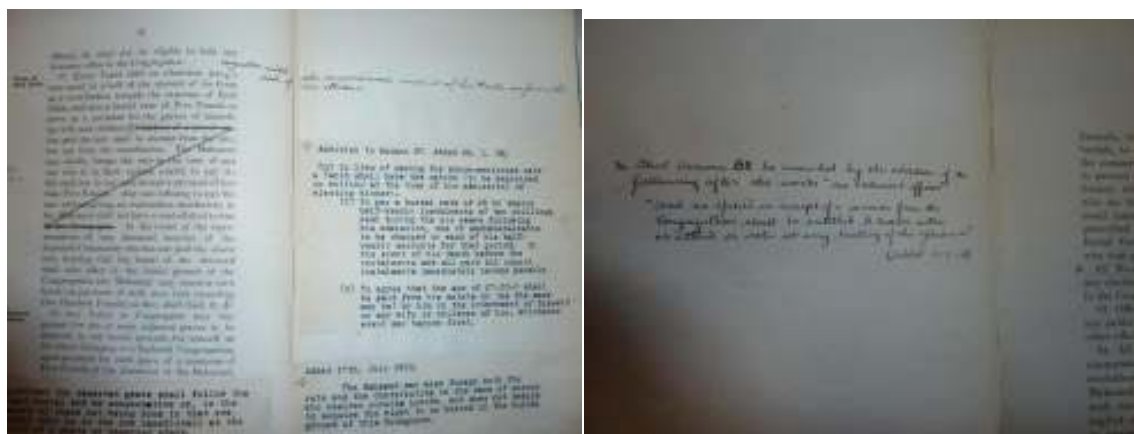
