1. AN ALBUM OF PHOTOGRAPHS OF PALESTINE AND EGYPT DURING WWI, MANY RELATING TO THE ROYAL AIR FORCE.

8vo notebook, 20.5 x 15.5 cm, containing 150 photographs (the majority silver prints plus 9 colotypes), mainly personal snapshots; blue cloth covers, worn and soiled. This album appears to have been compiled by Sgt. Bartlett 10423, whilst on a tour of duty in the Middle East. The majority of images in this album are captioned. There are aerial photograph views of Jerusalem, Jaffa and Gaza. There are views of Cairo, Heliopolis, Alexandria, Memphis, the Nile, Jerusalem, Bethlehem and Ramleh. Also some fascinating shots of downed German bi-planes, abandoned tanks, a contingent of Indian troops and a Turkish military camp outside Ramleh. There are three shots of the Holy Carpet being processed outside the Citadel in Cairo.



3. PHOTOGRAPH [DAVID (DOVID) BERGELSON] 1884 - 1952

A photograph (23 x 18 cm) inscribed and signed in Yiddish by David Bergelson.(1884 - 1952)the Yiddish writer. Born in the Ukraine he lived for a time in Berlin but returned to the Soviet Union with the rise to power of Hitler. He became a target of the antisemitic campaign against "rootless cosmopolitans." Arrested in January 1949, he was tried secretly and executed by a firing squad in the event



known as the Night of the Murdered Poets on August 12–13, 1952. After Stalin's death, he was posthumously rehabilitated in 1955, and his complete works were published in the Soviet Union in 1961. (Wikipedia) [ref: 16464]







13.MOORE, ROBERT WALTON (1859-1941) [ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF STATE] LETTER DEPARTMENT OF STATE REGARDING PALESTINE. Wahington DC Department of State 1936

A 2 page typed letter signed by Robert Walton Moore, Assistant Secretary of State, addressed to Rabbi Joseph Konvitz, President of the United States and Canada responding to a telegram he had sent to the Department of State regarding Jewish immigration to Palestine. Moore responds by 1) stating what he believes to be British Government policy and 2) by saying "With respect to your request that message be forwarded to the British Government, 'I must inform you that well established international practice does not permit a government to make itself a vehicle for transmission to other governments of communications from private individuals or organizations' The last paragraph says 'without elaboration, that this Government is at all times mindful of the situation the British Government is fully aware of the interest at this time of influential Jewish circles in the United States and elsewhere in the Palestinian immigration question." *Rabbi Konvitz was an uncle of Dayan Abamsky*

Abraham Goldsmid was one of the more prominent members of the wealthy Goldsmid family of English financiers. About 1777, Abraham and his brother, Benjamin, founded a brokerage partnership in London. Their business became very successful and eventually became involved in major government contracts. After the death of his brother


in 1808, Abraham took over, but soon after that, the fortunes of the business quickly declined, leaving him with unbearable debt. Payment of a very considerable loan was due on Sept. 28, 1810; the next morning Goldsmid was found dead with a pistol by his side. Over several years, the Goldsmid firm made great efforts to repay the loan. In 1820, Parliament, upon the creditors' petition, annulled the remaining debt. [ref: 4877]

smallest volume of our classics ever printed in Britain, and indeed the smallest reproduction of the Mishna altogether... It may claim to be the greatest production of this genre ever to emerge from Britain. In terms of Jewish classics, Anglo-Jewry has specialized in universally-acclaimed translations, such as the Soncino Talmud and the Soncino Midrash, in widely used English commentaries, such as the Hertz ChumashBlackman Mishnayoth, combining both translation and commentary. But we have not previously published new editions of Hebrew classics with new Hebrew commentaries for use by Torah scholars here and over the world."

Very good condition. It is unclear when this was first printed but there is a title page from 1919. However in the 1988 edition it says it was first published in 1967 and the copyright is from 1967. There is only one copy of the 1967 and one copy of the 1988 edition on COPAC. JTS and Harvard have the 1967 edition but not any earlier edition.
