Original wrappers, 59 pages and one map. The map is a large folding map showing the Concentration Camps. The "map was compiled by Rudolf Höss, the former Commandant of Auschwitz, later Deputy Inspector of Concentration Camps, during his detention while awaiting trial." Höss was the longest-serving commandant of Auschwitz Concentration Camp (from 4 May 1940 to November 1943, and again from 8 May 1944 to 18 January 1945). He tested and implemented means to accelerate the systematic extermination of the Jewish population of Nazi-occupied Europe, known as the Final Solution. On the initiative of one of his subordinates, Karl Fritsch, Höss introduced the pesticide Zyklon B to be used in gas chambers, where over a million people were killed [see Wikipedia] OCLC 810316240 - lists 5 copies [ref: 20116]

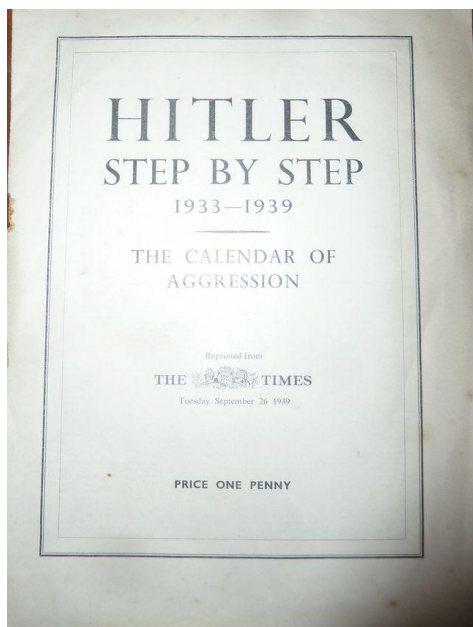

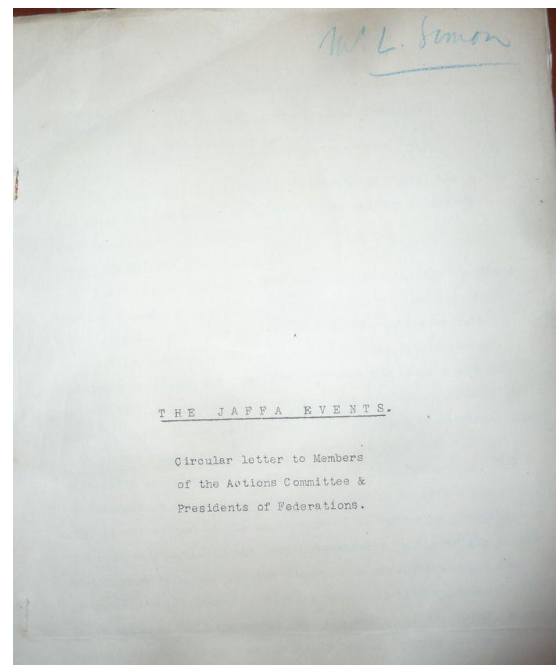

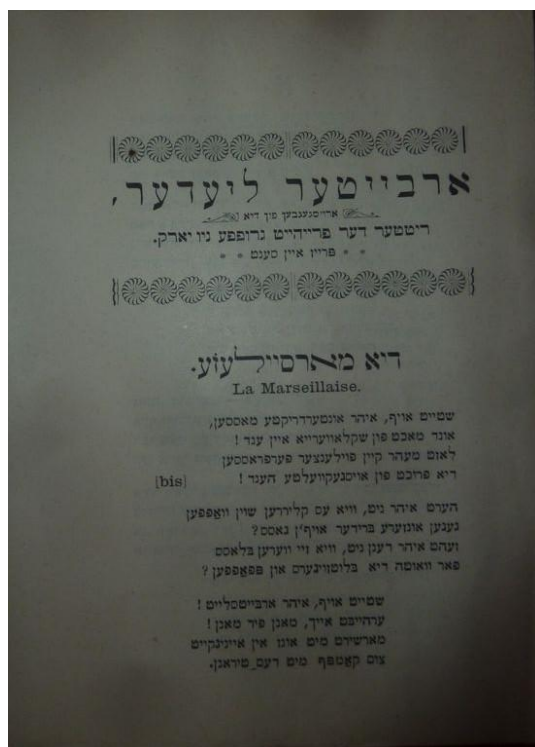
The internal disturbances in Palestine began in 1920 and 1921 and these preceded the more well-known disturbances of 1929.

This a circular letter to members of the Actions Committee [Zionist Movement] and Presidents of Federations, which gives information on events in Jaffa; how they may affect British public opinion towards the Mandate, and how they may affect Jewish public opinion towards the Zionist movement. It also discusses the question of defense in Jaffa, gives information on the 'Mopsi Group' (Jewish Communists) and also on the problems with immigration. 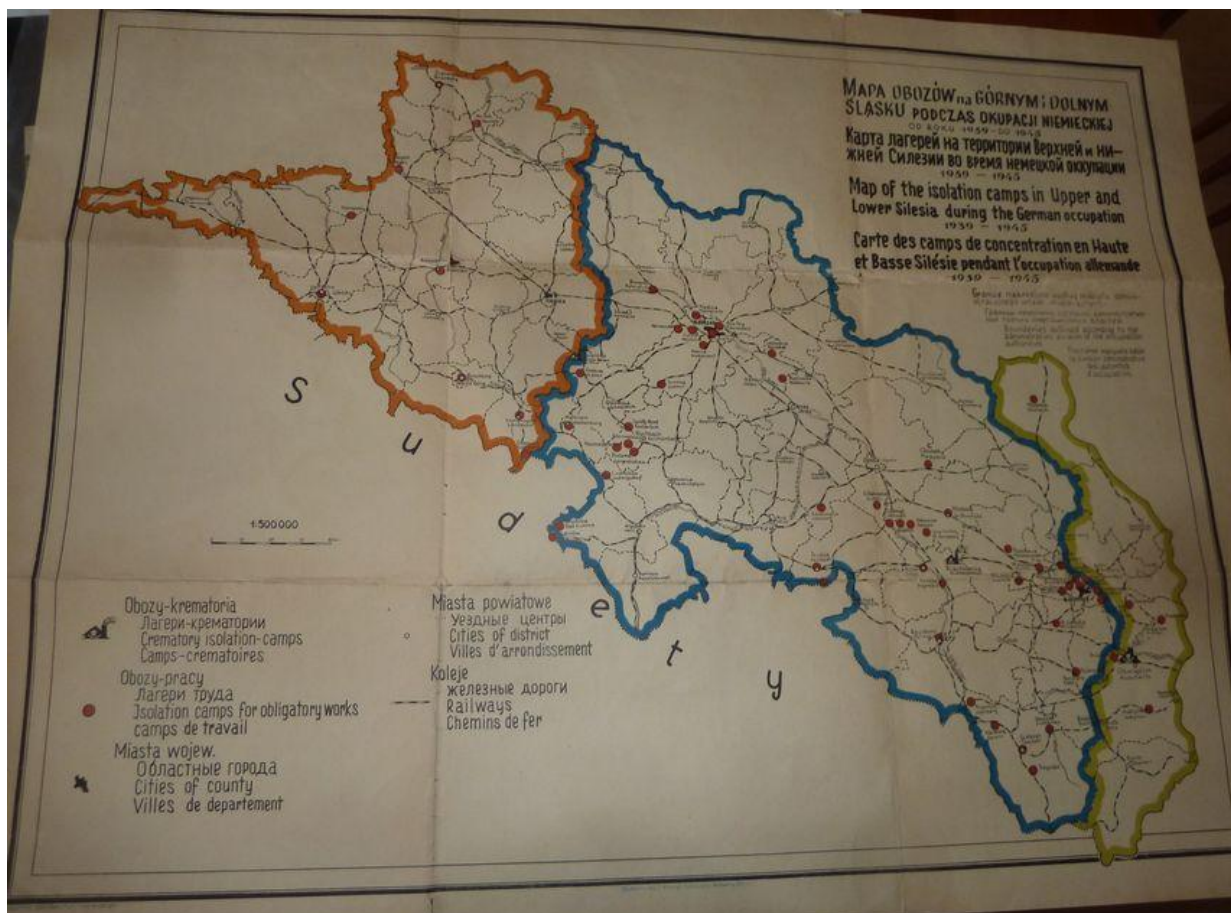

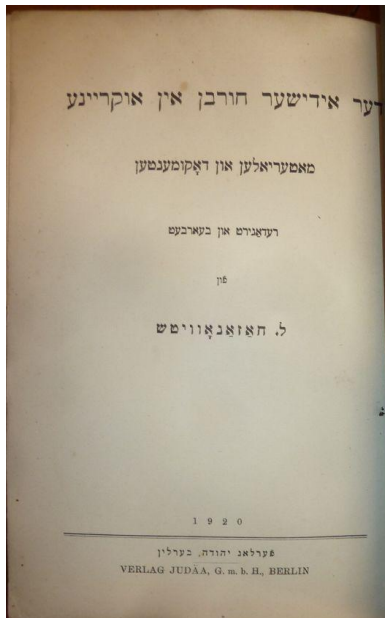

Mishnah. How does one hide the drinks? One hides them in the walls and under the floor, in pits, ditches and caves, in toilets, bathrooms, and any place out of reach of the city guardians.

Gemara. The rabbis have taught: The pious men of olden days used to hide the drinks in the walls and under the floor and in pits, bushes, and caves, but pious men of recent times have decided once and for all that there is no hope of storing them, so they immediately store them in their stomachs.

"Dear Sir and Friend: On behalf of thousands of milk drivers and inside workers in the independent milk plants who are members of the Milk Drivers' Union, we appeal to you, Mr. Groceryman and Dairy Storekeeper, not to buy any milk of non-Union milk companies, and not to permit any milk driver without a Union button to deliver milk to your premises. According to information that was lately piled up in our office, a number of retail grocers and dairy storekeepers seem to take advantage of the fact that certain companies against whom the Union is engaged in a bitter struggle to gain better working conditions for their drivers and inside workers are offering their milk and milk products below the wholesale marketing price. In order to gain a few more miserable pennies, such storekeepers are serving as a dumping ground for unfair milk companies fighting the Union. Permit us to draw your attention to the fact that it is a violation of the law in the State of New York to buy milk for less than the wholesale price established by the New York State Milk Control Board. Dealers who are offering you milk for less than the established price are committing a crime against this law, and any storekeeper who avails himself of such an illegal offer is also committing a crime punishable by the laws of the State of New York. Bear in mind, Mr. Storekeeper, that the law regulating the milk business in New York was created not only for your own benefit so that you can be guaranteed the full retail price from your customers, but also to protect the interests of the thousands of workers in the milk industry to derive a decent livelihood for their hard labors, and also to protect the legitimate milk dealer against cutthroat and dishonest competition. A dealer that offers you milk below the established wholesale price is in a position to do so only because he is underpaying his workers and forces them to work inhuman hours for a starving wage. Such dealer is in true fact your worst enemy, because of the fact that he is undermining the stability of the only article in your store on which you are guaranteed a reasonable and certain profit. It is in your interest to see to it that the milk business is regulated and protected from free-for-all competition. However, you must also bear in mind that, inasmuch as the state is protecting you in order for you to get your full price from the retail customer, you must also do your share to see to it that the interests of all other groups engaged in the milk industry are protected against dishonest competition. Whenever the Union is engaged in a fight against the company, the Union always has a just reason for it. The Union fights to force heartless dealers to heed the needs of their workers and to force them to pay a living wage. You storekeepers who are doing the bulk of your business mostly with poor workers should always be in the first line to help the workers in their struggle for a better livelihood. By being ever untidy to make another few extra pennies and buying milk from non-Union companies, you are committing an injustice directly against the workers of such companies in addition to committing a crime against a State law that was created for your own protection."
