The first section of the Raziel HaMalach, known as the Sepher HaMalbush, relates that soon after Adam HaRishon was exiled from the Garden of Eden, he prayed to God with remorse over his fall from grace, whereupon the Angel Raziel appeared in order to console Adam by imparting to him the wisdom of the Book of Raziel from which Adam's descendants would be equipped to foretell their future. An intricate formula with complex instructions follows, indicating preliminary actions to be performed prior to studying the text.

Included here are detailed spiritual laws of Nature, knowledge of the energy contained within the 22 letters of the Hebrew alphabet, the power of Man's soul within the confines of physicality; in other words, how to harmonize physical and spiritual existence in this material world.

This is the first Jewish cookbook published in English (see publisher's note by Ruth Gales and Lila Gold in the 1985 facsimile). Published anonymously, it was only identified decisively that it was by Lady Judith Montefiore by John Shaftesley (editor of the Jewish Chronicle) in 1975. There are a whole variety of recipes for meat, eggs, fish cakes and more. From the editor's preface

*"Among numerous works on Culinary Science already in circulation, there have been none which afford the slightest insight to the Cookery of Hebrew kitchen. Replete as many of these are with information on various important points, they are completely valueless to the Jewish housekeeper, not only on account of prohibited articles and combinations being assumed to be necessary ingredients of nearly every dish, but from the entire absence of all the receipts peculiar to the Jewish people."*

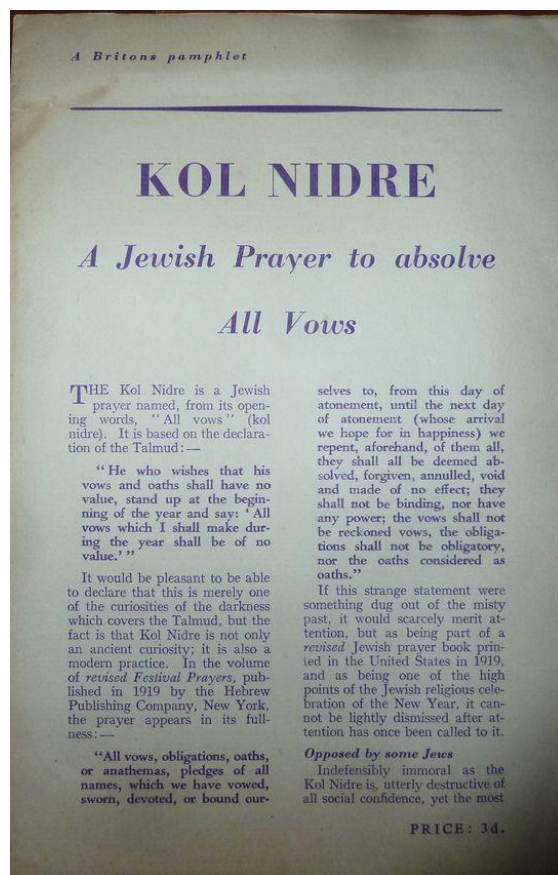

The Great Talmudical dictionary composed by Nathan ben Jehiel of Rome, and completed in 1101. According to Kohut Rashi was able to utilize some of it in the 2<sup>nd</sup> edition of his commentary (first parts of the Aruch were not written long before its completion). It is important for its many citations of Geonic sources, descriptions of Jewish customs, and citations of Midrashim which are not found in the extant editions. In addition, it is historically noteworthy as a rare literary production of the Italian Jews of this era. It was heavily utilized by Christian Hebraists. There is mis-foliation as in all copies. 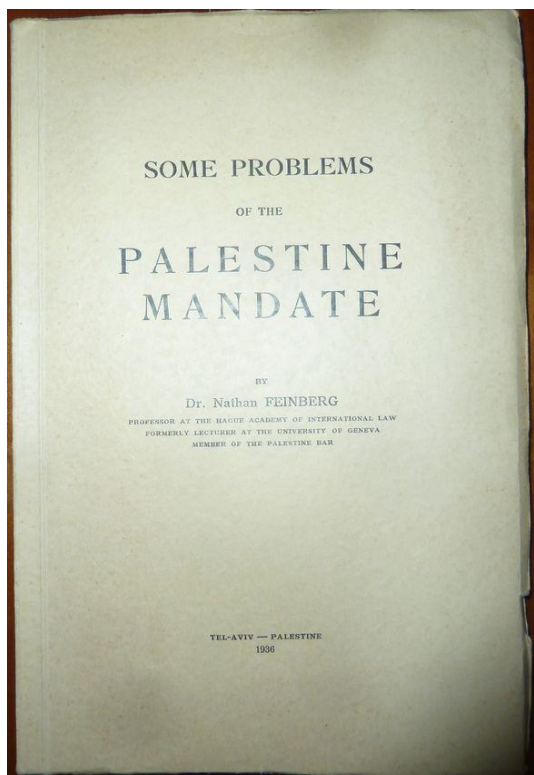

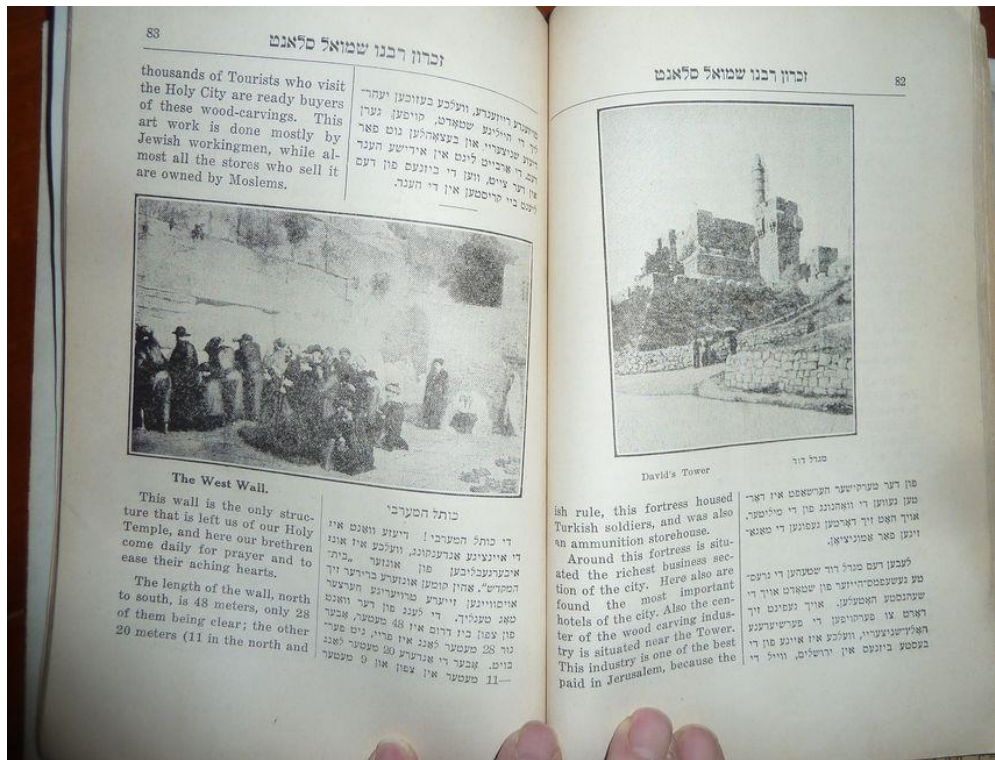
First edition, first printing, scarce, of one of a triumvirate of works by Sakai Shogun, all published in 1924, which outlined a worldview rooted in the Protocols and hyper-nationalism.

Sakai Shogun (1874-1940) was a Christian theologian and mystic who, by the early 1920s, had become an ultraconservative proponent of antisemitism. In the present work, Sakai expands on his belief that the kingdoms of Israel and Japan shared common origins in the ancient world and a common contemporary purpose: *“Culling the Protocols of the Elders of Zion, the Christian syncretist Sakai reasoned that when God’s son Jesus, God’s people the Jews, and God’s nation Japan came together, Zion would for the first time achieve global hegemony... Sakai’s fundamentalist advocacy of Zionism did little to mitigate his terror of Jewish power, however, for he believed that the Jews were ignorant of their common mission with Japan”* (Goodman & Miyazawa, pp. 84-5).

In 1927, Sakai acted as the interpreter for Yasue Norohiro (1888-1950) during his visit to Palestine to investigate the Jewish situation in the mandate. Yasue would become one of the leading architects of Japan’s Jewish policy, co-devising what later writers have termed the “Fugu Plan”.
