

An important photographic book of the journey from Europe to Palestine of the Jewish DPs immediately before the establishment of the State of Israel. OCLC 22520615



'In 1945-48, a mass illegal immigration scheme called Bricha, organized and transported more than 100,000 Jews past British patrols and into Palestine. The mass movement, staffed jointly by members of the Sh'eritha-Pletah and the Jewish armed forces from Palestine, used hachsharot (vocational training farms) and assembly centers in Europe as the staging grounds for moving survivors onto boats and across the Mediterranean Sea.' Comprises seven sermons delivered during the inauguration of the Portuguese synagogue in Amsterdam by: R. Yitzchak Aboab da Fonseca (the third), R. Shlomo de Oliveyra, R. Yitzchak Saruco, R. Yitzchak Nieto, R. Eliyahu Lopes, R. Yitzchak Vellozino and R. David Sarphati.

The book opens with two spreads of exquisite engravings by the Dutch artist Romeyn de Hooghe (1645-1708). The richly detailed engravings present various views of the synagogue -- the exterior, a plan of the interior, the sanctuary, the Torah ark, and more. One of the engravings depicts the inauguration ceremony with the members of the Jewish community in prayer in the center (women and children are seen amongst the community members at the forefront of the engraving).

The Portuguese synagogue in Amsterdam served the community of Spanish and Portuguese Jews who immigrated to the Netherlands in the wake of the inquisition, and their descendants. In 1670, with the encouragement of R. Yitzchak Aboab da Fonseca, the land upon which



the synagogue was to be built was purchased, and in 1675, on Motzaei Shabbat Parashat Nachamu, the inauguration ceremony was held with much fanfare. The celebrations continued for eight days (apparently inspired by the Maccabean reconsecration of the Temple; see: M.H. Ganz, Memorbook, p. 101).

1. Abraham Lopes Periera – A Dutch merchant who settled in London and died in 1813. He was a generous benefactor of the Portuguese Synagogue.
2. The Rt Hon Sir James Mansfield (1733-1821) A British lawyer, judge and politician. He was twice Solicitor General.

With 4 original ink signatures of translators and illustrators underneath colophon. Text of the Haggadah is in Hungarian and Hebrew on facing pages. Translated and annotated by Dr. Zoltan Kahn. Illustrated by Dr. Ernest Munkacsi, who also wrote the historical essay. The illustrations reproduced in red and yellow follow ancient Egyptian artistic motifs. The page borders and other ornaments continuing the Egyptian motifs were designed by Bertalon Gondor. Also includes black and white illustrations and facsimiles of pages from earlier illuminated manuscripts and printed texts. Introduction by Dr. Geza (Moshe) Ribary. Music annotations for various parts of the Seder. An example of sumptuous book craft, executed with loving attention to quality and detail. 



Contains photos of Soviet-Yiddish newspapers, photos from conferences of the Jewish Communist Party and a photo of the presidium of Yevsektsya which shows the author, Shmuel Agurski, among others.

Shmuel (Samuil) Agursky (1884-1947) was an activist of the Bund. After participating in the revolution of 1905, he emigrated to USA where he got involved in the anarchist movement. In 1917 he returned to Russia where he worked as a correspondent of the American press. In 1918 he joined the Communist party and was one of the founders of the Jewish Section (Yevsektsya). In 1938, he was arrested and sentenced to five years of exile in Kazakhstan. Died in 1947 *OCLC 19316021 [ref: 11554]*







Maurice Fishberg (August 16, 1872 – August 30, 1934) was a Jewish-American physical anthropologist who specialised in the ethnology of the Jews. Fishberg was born in Kamenetz Podolsky (now Ukraine) and died in New York City. There are chapters on the physical characteristics, types of Jews, proselytism and intermarriage, the demographics, the pathology, social disabilities and their effects on the Jews and Assimilation versus Zionism. 



executive order by King Georg III of the United Kingdom, Ireland and France to prohibit the intake of "Bettel-Juden" [Beggar-Jews] and Jews immigrating from Poland entering his country. To prevent the spread of the plague from Poland the document orders all border guards to refuse entry and tighten border control to his kingdom of Jews from Poland or "Bettel-Juden", beggars and gypsies as many "Bettler-Juden" managed to elude border controls by taking off-road routes. Moreover, he demands that all royal main roads be patrolled and local taverns be searched regularly.

Antisemitic ordinance from the Duchy of Brunswick-Lüneburg reiterating earlier decrees forbidding Jewish beggars (Bettel-Juden) from entering German lands, especially from Poland, and expressing frustration with local officials' lack of action to enforce these decrees. Particular concern is given to the possibility that

Jews could spread a contagious epidemic from Poland and Turkey (possibly the Russian plague epidemic of 1770-1772).







Vishniac was a photographer who was born in Russia, moved to Berlin, then Paris and eventually the USA (constantly moving because of antisemitism). He also had scientific training and became a freelance photographer specializing in photomicroscopy. He is best known for his evocative photos of Eastern European Jewry in the leadup to the Holocaust. In 1935, as antisemitism was growing in Germany, Vishniac was commissioned by the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee (JDC) in Central Europe to photograph Jewish communities in Eastern Europe as part of a fund-raising drive to help support these poor communities. Vishniac developed and printed these pictures in his darkroom in his Berlin apartment. Further trips to Eastern Europe were undertaken between 1935 and 1938, again at the behest of the JDC. These photographs were taken with a hidden camera both because photographers are often suspected of being spies and the reluctance of the subjects to be photographed. The results are hugely evocative images which have shaped our view of pre-war Jewry. Each one is approximately 25 x 20 cm. Provenance: This silver prints, printed in 1973 or before, have the stamp of Vishniac's New York Studio on the reverse and some has his annotation. It was given as a gift to a film maker who made a film from still photographs for the Museum of the Diaspora [ref: 22042]
